Speed reductions, crosswalk signals planned for Rte. 113

Town safety committee, working with SHA, has secured improvements

BERLIN-The Pedestrian Safety Committee, working with State Highway Administration officials, has secured in record time commitments for new projects to improve safety along U.S. Route 113, between Old Ocean City Boulevard and Germantown Road, according to a presentation by Patricia Dufendach to the Mayor and Town Council on Feb. 10.

Dufendach, a committee member, served as spokesman for the group during a status report to the town council at the meeting. Mayor Gee Williams convened the committee in response to a Nov. 8 traffic accident at the dangerous intersection of Rt. 113 and Bay Street that killed one teenager and severely injured his brother.

While the tragedy was a frustrating blow to the nearby community, which had been calling for improved traffic and pedestrian safety measures for

years, the accident seemed to galvanize the two demographically different segments of the town that had been historically separated by a major highway into a unified alliance to ensure that changes were finally made.

Dufendach said committee members met with Donnie Drewer, District 1 engineer for the SHA and Dallas Baker, Jr., District 1 transportation engineer, and described the officials as helpful and cooperative. In a short amount of time the public officials and private citizens of the committee had made unprecedented accomplishments, the mayor commented.

The SHA has agreed to lower the speed limit to 45 miles per hour, from the area located one-half mile north of Old Ocean City Boulevard to the area located one-half mile south of Germantown Road, according to Dufendach. While she noted the committee had requested the speed limit be dropped to 35 m.ph., the 10 m.p.h. drop from the current 55 m.p.h. speed limit was nevertheless a welcomed change.


Hazard lights will be installed at each end of the area to alert drivers to the lowered speed zone and the fact that drivers

are entering a populated area within 18 months. An electronic message sign will be used in the interim, she said.

A crosswalk will be installed at Bay Street and Rt. 113—the site where the November accident occurred—by midto late-March, Dufendach said. In nine months, equipment will be added to allow pedestrians to initiate the signal, which will include an audible alarm and a visible countdown timer.

The committee focused on three core issues, according to Dufendach: improving visibility of pedestrians in the area, which was dimly lit due to a lack of adequate lighting; erecting signage to make motorists aware that Berlin Intermediate School was adjacent to the highway; and increasing safety conditions at the South Main Street and Germantown Road intersection used as a main access route for Worcester Preparatory School and Buckingham Elementary School.

The lack of lighting along the Berlin corridor was due to an expired Worcester County service contract, Dufendach reported. Due to the committee's efforts, when the new contract begins this spring repairs for the Berlin area will be at the top of the list, she said.

The only two requested items the SHA denied was a school zone notification sign on Rt. 113 near BIS, because the front of BIS is located on Franklin Avenue, not Rt. 113, and a traffic light at Germantown Road and South Main

Street, because a study conducted Dec. 18, showed the level of traffic at the intersection did not warrant one at this time.

However, Dufendach said the officials gave their commitment to continue to monitor the area for changes that might necessitate a reconsideration of the situation, such as additional commercial development or new traffic conditions.

Remarking on the speed and extensiveness of the upcoming changes for the intersection, Dufendach said, "This is just a big step for Berlin."

The Pedestrian Safety Committee included Berlin Councilmembers Dean Burrell and Lisa Hall, Berlin Town Administrator Laura Allen, Berlin Police Chief Arnold Downing, and residents Sue Beaman, Roxie Dennis and Dufendach, Gabe Purnell and Neil Winn.

Mayor Williams commended the committee for its work and added that the physical improvements were but one of three components of the pedestrian safety initiative.

The other two components, as described by Dufendach would include pavement markings to reduce confusion for motorists making turns in the intersection and, because of the reduced speed limit, bicycle lane markings and signage that are required on roads with speed limits at or below 45 m.p.h.

Williams said the results were, "A great example of civic engagement" that could set a precedent for all sorts of things in the community.



Passwords must be stronger to protect against identity thefts

In light of recent events with some major retailers, here are some ways to help protect your identity from theft.



Identity thieves love passwords because they open doors to our personal information. If possible, use different passwords for all your accounts, and make those passwords strong with at least eight char-

acters, including a mix of letters and numbers. Hide them safely, and keep them accessible. This may take some extra work, but fixing an identity theft problem is tougher.

Protect your Social Security number. Never carry your card with you, or any other card that may have your number (like an insurance card). Also, don't put the number on your checks. It's a major target for identity thieves because it gives them access to your credit report and bank accounts.

Always monitor your credit report. Get and carefully review your credit report at least once a year to check for suspicious activity. If you find something, alert your card company or the creditor immediately. You may also look into credit protection services, which alerts you any time a change takes place with your credit report.

Destroy private records and statements. Tear up or shred credit cards statements, solicitations, and other documents that contain private financial information.

Secure your mail. Empty your mailbox quickly, lock it or get a post office box so no one will have a chance to steal any credit card offers you may receive. Also, don't mail outgoing bill payments and checks from home. They can be stolen from your mailbox and the payee's name erased with solvents. Mail them from the post office or another secure location.

Don't leave a paper trail. Never leave ATM, credit card or gas station receipts behind.

Never let your credit card out of your sight. Worried about credit card skimming? Always keep an eye on your card or, when that's not possible, pay with cash.

Know who you're dealing with. Whenever anyone contacts you asking for private identity or financial information, make no response other than to find out who they are, what company they represent and the reason for the call. If you think the request is legitimate, contact the company yourself and confirm what you were told before revealing any of your personal data.

Take your name off telemarketers' lists. In addition to the national Do-Not-

Call registry, you can also cut down on junk mail and opt out of credit card solicitations.

Be more defensive with personal information. Ask salespeople and others if information such as a Social Security number or driver's license number is absolutely necessary. Ask anyone who does require your Social Security number about their privacy policy, and that you do not want your information given to anyone else.

Review your credit cards statements carefully. Make sure you recognize the merchants, locations and purchases listed before paying the bill. If you don't need or use department-store or bankissued credit cards, consider closing the accounts.

But Cazenovia, though with about half as many residents, is a college town located not far from Syracuse. Based on recent numbers, it appears as if the town is going after this with the same commitment shown by Berlin.

The word about Berlin is getting around the state. Mayor Gee Williams told Bayside Gazette after Monday's council meeting that Gov. Martin O'-Malley made mention of Berlin's "cool status" at a recent Maryland Mayors Conference. Williams was all smiles when he recounted how mayors from towns across the state wished him well in the contest.

"It made you feel good," he said.

Michael Day, the town's Director of Economic and Community Development, said that at the end of the preliminary voting, Berlin was holding onto third place. But when the voting reopened in mid-January, the town took the lead.

Gibbons stepping down as Berlin Public Works director

Town council members commend him for service and leadership

BERLIN-During the Feb. 10 town council meeting, Mayor Gee Williams announced that Public Works Director Michael Gibbons would be leaving on Feb. 28 to accept a position as Public Works Director for the Town of Fruitland, prompting several council members to commend him for his service and leadership in the Town of

Williams told Gibbons he was leaving his department "much more self-sufficient than it was before." Councilmember Paula Lynch noted that Gibbons could be counted on for an attitude of focusing on how to resolve the given tasks presented to him. "You raised the bar," she said.

According to a description provided by Town Administrator Laura Allen, Gibbons began his tenure in

Berlin in 2008, after working for a private home builder, and earned certifications as a playground safety inspector and a pesticide applicator while in the position.

Among his key accomplishments in Berlin, according to Allen, Gib-

initiated the use of an automated sanitation truck; worked closely with Grow Berlin Green to add a 30 yard container downtown to capture more recycling collections from businesses; supervised the installation of new Adults with Disabilities Act-compliant sidewalks on several roadways; started a compost area for organic debris, which helped the environment and saved the town money by eliminating landfill fees; developed a systematic approach for snow removal; converted the town's pole barn from a one-bay to a two-bay shop, which allowed the town to save money by doing more mechanical work inhouse; introduced cutting edge technologies for road paving, such as glass grid reinforcement with overlays and geotextile fabric with tar and chip applications, which will extend the life expectancy of town streets; and renovated several roads, includ-

ing Maple, Washington, Harrison,

Vine, Graham, Grice and Franklin.

Hudson presents Ocean Pines fiscal year budget reviews

Committee OPA needs strong data collection capabilities for all depts.

OCEAN PINES-In his last action as Chairman of the Ocean Pines Association Budget and Finance Advisory Committee Dennis Hudson presented the Board of Directors with the committee's annual fiscal year budget review and guidance during a Feb. 3 meeting.

Primarily, the committee seemed to

focus on finding ways to give General Manager Bob Thompson and his staff the support needed to enhance the accuracy of development planning and project decision-making. For example, the committee said the OPA needed strong data collection capabilities across all departments and business lines, including the supporting hardware, software and personnel needed to make that happen.

The budget committee concurred with the Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee's recommendation to contract with the Business Economic and Community Outreach Network, in the Franklin P. Perdue School of Business at Salisbury University (BEACON).

The program's expertise would allow the OPA to create a tool to analyze the community's needs as an effective comprehensive 10-year plan is being developed, the committee advised. "We would like to see the 'rack & stack' backed up by solid need analysis with accurate cost estimates," budget committee members said.

The advisory committee suggested the board consider initiating a comprehensive plan that would help the association better measure its organizational and budget goals.

"This is difficult today due to poor reporting systems, manual calculations and disconnected systems that handicap management," according to one of the items listed in the budgetary guidance. They added, "This should be paramount in capital planning and be directed and managed by the BOD."

The committee provided a list of 15 specific operational or capital recommendations, starting with a suggestion discouraging any increase in the annual assessment. The board subsequently approved a \$5 assessment decrease in the \$914 annual base assessment.

Other recommendations offered by the Budget and Finance Advisory Committee included:

 finding a more effective way of marketing a proposed \$25 member's coupon for use at the new Yacht Club and questioning whether it needed to be funded by a \$10 increase in the assessment and

whether it was needed at all, given that incentives to use the new Yacht Club would likely be unnecessary when it first opens. Board members suggested the idea might be better received as a gift certificate instead;

- reviewing the Yacht Club's revenues. The committee estimated given the newness of the facility and significant early banquet bookings, the Yacht Club should have a break-even budget with approximately \$98,000 in additional revenue, which should eliminate the need for \$5 of the assessment;
- reviewing the documentation used to support budgeted amenities' costs. Hudson said the committee strongly questioned some of the proposed fee increases and that some of the estimates produced seemed overly optimistic, based on past performance;
- further studying the rationale for increasing membership fees for amenities with declining memberships or sales volume, such as marina services or the golf
- · waiting for a review by an upcoming drainage taskforce before approving new personnel additions proposed for the Public Works Department. The committee noted that the department's budget included \$35,000 in current overtime expenses while simultaneously requesting four new employees to handle drainage issues. The committee asked the board to consider whether it would be more cost efficient if the additional drainage work

could be contracted out instead;

- staffing the previously-approved position for a human resources professional to help manage the OPA workforce, payroll and benefit structure;
- allowing the Golf Club to show that it can break even on its own, using the expertise and course upgrades that have been put in place and implemented from recommendations of management company Billy Casper Golf;
- charging a \$250 to \$1,000 entry fee during real estate closings for first-time home buyers purchasing in Ocean Pines so the revenue could be used for road improvements in lieu of decreasing casino dollars:
- · asking the Worcester County Commissioners to help support OPA's parks and recreation programs through additional funds since those activities are not restricted to OPA residents and increasing fees for non-residents who use the OPA's activities, events, and amenities;







Maryland casinos generate

(Feb. 14, 2014) The Maryland Lottery and Gaming Control Agency announced January revenue numbers for the state's four casinos-Hollywood Casino Perryville in Cecil County, Casino at Ocean Downs in Worcester County, Maryland Live Casino in Anne Arundel County, and Rocky Gap Casino Resort in Allegany

January's combined statewide revenue totaled \$66,222,363.

Casino at Ocean Downs generated \$3,170,217 in January, and its gross gaming revenue per unit per day was \$127.83. Casino at Ocean Downs' January 2014 revenue increased by \$241,298 or 8 percent, from January 2013. The Casino at Ocean Downs operates 800 slot machines.


Hollywood Casino Perryville generated \$6,309,491 from both slot machines and table games in January. Gross gaming revenue per unit per day was \$148.02 for slot machines, \$2,332.58 for banking table games and \$413.05 for non-banking table games. Hollywood Casino's January

Maryland Live Casino generated \$53,713,344 from both slot machines and table games in January. Eric Fiori opens second location for his Bayside Jet Drive LLC company

BERLIN—Just off quiet Friendship Road, a short jump from the frenzied Route 90 corridor leading to Ocean City, Eric Fiori has opened the second location for his company Bayside Jet Drive, L.L.C., a dealership for personal watercraft and jet boats.

Some may remember what these toys for water-based adrenaline addicts started out as—basically more fun to watch than to ride, due to the fact that hitting water at top speed on them was like riding a sleigh on concrete. This new generation of personal watercraft comes loaded with an impressive array of comforts and technological upgrades that make them look more like the popular Transformers toys and movie characters than wave skippers.

Fiori, who on Feb. 11 was in the process of preparing for the Seaside Boat Show at the Ocean City Convention Center that begins Feb. 14, says his most frequent customers are in the 50 to 70-year-old age group, basically the same baby boomer retirees who make amped-up motorcycles so much fun to admire along the highway. The price ranges for the personal watercraft are from \$8,000 to \$17,000, and for jet boats the price range is from \$27,000 to \$60,000

First, the technology and reliability of the latest versions of personal watercraft and jet boat equipment has come far beyond where the earlier vehicles began, he said. For example, according

to Fiori, the average life span of the watercraft is 15 years, with a warranty claim rate of less than 5 percent.

Second, the machines are absolutely beautiful. Fiori carries Yamaha Wave Runners and Kawasaki Jet Skis with cushioned seating capacities for up to three people, and full-sized Yamaha jet boats from 19 to 24 feet. He also sells EZ Loader and Load Rite trailers for easy transport to a body of water of your choosing, which he said was usually in, but not limited to, the bay.

Third, purchases include such personal touches as demonstrations and instructions, along with customized orders and home delivery.

The 36-year-old transplant from Pasadena, Md., who comes from a fam-

ily of entrepreneurs, said his dealerships are family-run operations. He has one brother, who has a land management company in Oregon.

Berlin council members to meet on redistricting plan

State's plans would have two duly elected office holders lose their seats

BERLIN-The Berlin Town Council will meet on Feb. 19 to continue discussions on a proposed redistricting plan, Town Administrator Laura Allen announced during the Feb. 10 council

In December, the Berlin Town Council and Mayor Gee Williams agreed to take another and closer look at how a computerized modeling system incorporates new census data to define future election districts. Williams said the councilmembers had requested that Nasrin Rahman, manager of the Maryland Department of Planning's Redistricting and Reapportionment Office, meet with the council in person, to demonstrate how the modelling was conducted and to further explain the proposed changes.

Two of the first proposals created under the computerized system proposed plans that would result in unseating two duly elected officials, Councilmember Dean Burrell (District 4), and Town Council Vice President Elroy Brittingham (District 3).

The redistricting of Berlin's election district boundaries is in response to updated population data from the 2010 U.S. Census and is meant to keep the town's four election districts of equal size (1,124 residents), by ensuring that no district deviates by more than 5 percent of the 1,124 resident goal. Berlin has a population of 4,496 residents, according to the adjusted data. According to the town Web site, the next regular municipal election is scheduled for Tuesday, Oct. 13, for the council seats in Districts 1 and 4, and At-large.

AGH, other facilities await soon-to-be gas conversions

Berlin Nursing, Rehab Center, Kelly Foods all in line for completions

BERLIN-Atlantic General Hospital, the Berlin Nursing and Rehabilitation Center and Kelly Foods are awaiting completion of their conversions to natural gas.

The Barrett Medical Building has been converted to natural gas and those three are just waiting on a specialty order for conversion parts.

Stephen Decatur Middle School and Stephen Decatur High School have been converted to natural gas.

Sandpiper Energy's first conversions to natural gas took place last summer at the feed mill and asphalt plant along Route 113 in Showell.

Sandpiper's conversions will proceed along the northern part of Berlin and go in a circular fashion along the west side of town, Department of Environmental Programs Director Bob Mitchell told the Worcester County Commissioners last Tuesday. After completing about 75 percent of the conversions in Berlin, the company will begin upgrades in the northern

part of Ocean Pines and the commercial area around Walmart. That work would likely be later this year.

More areas might have been converted by now, but "the weather hasn't been the greatest," Mitchell said.

Sandpiper Energy was formed after Chesapeake Utilities acquired the operating assets of Eastern Shore Gas and its affiliate, Eastern Shore Propane Company last May. Sandpiper will provide propane and natural gas to Worcester County residences and businesses.

Last summer, Chesapeake Utilities estimated that Sandpiper Energy would save customers more than \$1 million.

All of Sandpiper's customers will have the same rate for energy use, whether they use propane or if they have converted to natural gas. In this way, the cost of converting the distribution system and converting individual customers is shared by all customers. Those customers will also share in the savings associated with the less expensive natural gas.

Converting the underground propane distribution system used by Eastern Shore Gas in the Berlin, Ocean Pines and West Ocean City area is expected to take four to six years.



Funds available for entrepreneurs

WORCESTER COUNTY-Some Worcester County entrepreneurs may benefit from more than \$500,000 available in loans this year to create new jobs and support business expansion.

In 2013, Worcester County's share of VOLT (Video Lottery Terminal) funds for small, minority and women-owned businesses was \$500,000.

"We're looking to get more than that this year," Merry Mears, deputy director of the county's Economic Development Department, said.

"The casinos have been doing very well," said Bill Badger, director of the county's Economic Development Department.

The county's Economic Development Department partnered with the Anne Arundel Economic Development Corporation, one of three designated fund managers, in seeking the funds.

The request for proposals for the new cycle of funds is being negotiated and should be ready soon.

This year, she said, the county would not need to re-apply.

The loans, which are priced at or below current market interest rates, may be used for business acquisition, commercial real estate acquisition, building improvements, purchase of equipment, business start-up costs, working capital, and in some cases, refinancing of existing debt.

Owners of existing businesses, as well as qualified people who want to start a business, may apply for the loans, which start at \$25,000.

In 2013, four loans were approved for Worcester County businesses. The transaction for the first loan of 2014 was settled last week for an Ocean City busi-

Sandpiper will communicate with propane gas customers and new customers to inform them about the opportunity to switch from propane to natural gas.

It must also be determined which appliances can be converted from propane gas to natural gas.

Since last spring, members of the county staff have been working with Sandpiper Energy and the staff of Chesapeake Utilities to go over inspection and review procedures for the conversion process.

The county will require permits and inspections by its plumbing/gas inspectors on all upgrades, no matter how small they might be.

So far, the work has gone smoothly, Mitchell said.

Children's Dental Health Month

It is an opportunity to use a new educational bulletin board, "Love That Smile" downloadable from the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene's Ofof Oral Health Web site, http://phpa.dhmh.-maryland.gov/oralhealth. The free bulletin board highlights proven ways to prevent tooth decay including proper brushing and flossing, oral injury prevention, nutrition, and the importance of fluoride and sealants.

A healthy mouth is important for overall wellbeing. Poor oral health during childhood can cause problems with eating, speaking, and learning. Each year, more than 51 million school hours are missed due to dental problems. Tooth decay is five times more common than asthma in children.

Children's Dental Health Month is celebrated nationally. For recognizing this month Maryland's Office of Oral Health's Web site provides games to test your dental knowledge. This website provides other links to additional dental educational materials including a request form to order bulk quantities of free oral health materials, assistance in obtaining children's Medicaid dental health insurance (Maryland Healthy Smiles Dental Program), and information on how to find public dental serv-

There are several tips for preventing

tooth decay in children:

- · Schedule a child's first dental visit when his or her first tooth appears, or by the first birthday.
- •Provide children with healthy snacks such as fruits and vegetables and avoid sugary foods and drinks. Give them water to drink between meals. (Sip all day get decay.)
- ·Always apply a small amount of fluoride toothpaste and brush teeth twice a
- •Children require brushing supervision until seven to eight years of age.
- •Ask your dentist about the need for fluoride supplements.
- •Check with your local health department or water board to have your water tested to determine the amount of fluoride in your water. If it is too low to prevent tooth decay, ask your dentist or physician about fluoride tablets or drops.
- •Ask your dentist when dental sealants can be applied to your child's permanent molars.
- •Start flossing teeth when they touch. For additional tips and resources visit the following Web sites.





Flap results in delay of vote on nomination for Joseph Gill

Mathias cites official's responsibility 'to act courteously' in office

MARYLAND— A dust up between the Maryland Waterman's Association and Department of Natural Resources Acting Secretary Joseph Gill over a bill proposing changes to the rules governing the state's fishery management policy has apparently led to the withdrawal of the legislation and the delay of a vote on Gill's nomination for secretary of the

According to a Feb. 6 statement by Delegate Michael McDermott, tempers flared between Gill and Robert T. Brown, president of the Maryland Watermen's Association, outside the House Environmental Matters Committee on Jan. 29. The committee was considering SB 145/HB 145, a bill that proposed changing DNR's notification practices in a way that would officially allow the agency to continue to issue certain directives without legislative action.

A legislative analysis of the bill pointed out that current DNR plans and proposed conservation and management measures must be adopted by regulation and thus are subject to legislative review. McDermott said, in recent years, DNR officials have changed certain regulations by simply providing public notice, to avoid the need to bring these changes before the General Assembly or to the Administrative, Executive and Leg-

islative Review Committee when the legislature was not in session.

"The Attorney General recently told the DNR that they do not have the authority to bypass the legislative branch," McDermott said.

The proposed legislation would have officially codified the agency's authority to make policy changes — which would include opening or closing fishing seasons, modifying harvestable areas, or changing catch limits — by public notice in as short a time period as 48 hours, rather than by the longer regulation process.

Brown was at the hearing to testify that Eastern Shore watermen opposed the bill, which Gill was there to support. In a Jan. 31 letter to Committee Chairman Maggie McIntosh (D-43) Brown said Gill approached him as they were leaving the hearing and according to Brown said, "If this bill [{meaning HB 145}] does not pass, I will be so conservative and cut quotas and I will hurt you. Did you hear me! I will hurt you!" Brown asked McIntosh to take action against Gill for making the threat and cc'd the letter to Gill.

In an attempt to clarify his remarks made during the exchange, Gill responded to Brown on Jan. 31 in a letter stating, "What I was trying to convey in our conversation was what it would mean if the department lacked the authority to adjust seasons by public notice."

Gill offered to meet with Brown in an effort to build trust and improve the working relationship between the agency and the watermen. Of the proposed bill, Gill said, "I think you would agree that the authority we have had over the past decade has benefitted the watermen because, for example, it has allowed us to set the harvest based upon the most current data, and extend the fishery where quota has not been caught or in cases of bad weather." Gill contin-

ued, "The Attorney General has said that we have this authority, but if we did not, the Department would be forced to establish more conservative quota allocations which we could not adjust."

Gill apologized for what he described as a possible misperception and told Brown his remarks were meant to convey that a failure of the legislation would be harmful to watermen generally. "So my intention was to convey that possible result to you. At no point did I intend for the message to come across as personal to you or any other watermen."

Brown posted the letters on the Maryland Watermen's Association Web site, and reportedly the incident prompted several local government officials to express their concerns over the comments to the General Assembly leadership and Gov. Martin O'Malley and Lt. Gov. Anthony Brown.

The Senate version of the bill was withdrawn on Feb. 10. A motion by Sen. Richard Colburn (R-37) for a special order to delay the vote on Gill's nomination as secretary until Feb. 14 was approved on Feb. 1. "It now appears that the Senate Executive Nominations Committee (of which I am a member) may have another hearing on Mr. Gill's nomination on March 3rd," Colburn said in a statement.

Sen. Jim Mathias (D-38) said in a Feb. 5 statement that he shared Colburn's concern about Gill's alleged comments. "State officials, whether elected or appointed, have a responsibility to act courteously and to provide the best possible services to the people they serve, regardless of any philosophical or professional differences they may have," he said.

McDermott called the vote to delay consideration of Gill's nomination "a wise move as the nominee is now held in contempt by all of the watermen."

Flat iron steak for a successful dinner

Plans do not always come together; that is the way of it. Eventually things always seem to get done. Whether it's getting the kids off to school or trying

to knock out schoolwork, there's always that one phone call. That one friendly stop in the supermarket where you end up talking to an old friend for half an hour. Then the

deadlines creep up on you.

Sensing that this was going to be a busy year, I have tried to stay organized and well managed, but then I end up reverting to the 'good lord, I need more time in my day routine.

At the end of such a day, we need to sit down, take a breather, and enjoy a hearty and filling meal. With my myriad projects, the aforementioned hearty meal end up being a fast food meal, truly a disgraceful meal when compared with what could be had at

Luckily, I asked to be on the selection committee for the new club's management hiring team. As such, I get to sit in on the selection process, AKA tastings. The first tasting was by a chef whom I know from D.C. and I am flat-out stealing his flat iron steak offered up for the tasting.

It was the perfect end to an absolutely insane day. Between working, visiting Mom in the hospital, a chef's meeting and this, I felt like I was being pulled in every direction. Dinner brought it all back together for me. It was an intelligent dish and one that prefaced the final instruction of the meal: "it's 2 a.m., chef. What can you



cook for me?"

After a plate of buffalo shrimp that far surpassed my rendition, everyone sat back and agreed that if this was the first, it will be interesting to see what happens in the latter tastings.

The plan came together after all. Now that this is done, I can get ready for the next thing on my docket. Bring it on plan disrupters. Bring it on.

Flat Iron Steak

Serves 4

4 6 oz. flat iron steaks salt and pepper, as needed clarified butter, as needed

2 c. bacon preserves (recipe follows) 1 # potato-parsnip puree (recipe fol-

1 # roasted brussel sprouts (recipe fol-

Trim flat iron so the majority of gristle has been removed.

You can marinate this steak for better flavor but you certainly do not need to. If you do decide to marinate it, just use a quick marinade and allow to sit, refrigerated, for at least two hours.

Season steak and set on a plate for about 20 minutes to allow it to come up in temperature, a process we like to call slacking.

Heat a pan with until it is very hot but just below smoking (meaning that when butter is added it won't scorch and smoke).

Add clarified butter and add the steak. For a small pan, add one steak. If the pan is large, thick and can retain heat well, you can add more. You just need to ensure

that adding the steaks won't bring down the temperature of the pan too drastically.

Sear steaks for about four minutes or until they have a nice crust. In the meantime, spoon the sizzling butter on top of the steak.

Turn steaks over and repeat the process until the meat is at 135F for medium rare.

Remove and allow to rest for at least five minutes while ingredients are assembled.

Place the sprouts on a warmed plate, top with steak and bacon preserves, and serve with root vegetable

Bacon Preserves

for 2 cups 1/2 # bacon 1/2 ea. medium white onion Brown sugar, as needed

Good sherry vinegar, as needed Lay out bacon on a sheet pan and bake at 350 until crispy.

Place bacon drippings in a frying pan and heat, adding the onion once the heat is at a medium range.

Cook for approximately one hour or

until the onions are well-caramelized and a touch past golden.

Chop bacon and set aside until the very end.

To the fat/onion mixture, add sugar and vinegar to taste, but when tasting it . be careful.

Once your flavors have melded add the chopped bacon and do one more seasoning to finish.

Keep warm until service.

Potato-Parsnip Puree

makes 1 pound

8 oz. russet potatoes, peeled and diced 4 oz. parsnips, peeled and diced 2 garlic cloves, crushed

1 c. heavy cream

1/4 c. chicken stock (optional) Salt and pepper as needed

Combine everything except salt and pepper in a saucepan and bring to a simmer.

Cook until very tender but do not allow to scorch. Once tender, puree with a stick

blender until smooth.

Adjust seasoning and keep hot until service.

Brussel Sprouts

makes about 1 pound

1 # brussel sprouts, halved and cored Olive oil, as needed

Salt and pepper, as needed

Bring a pan of water to a boil and add salt. Add the sprouts and cook for a few

minutes or until tender.

Pull out of the water and heat a sauté pan, adding oil when hot.

Sauté the sprouts until done and keep hot until service.


