NEW SHOWELL ELEMENTARY

Despite the coronavirus pandemic, the construction of the new Showell Elementary School off Route 589 in Berlin continued as scheduled according to a report by the county school system's Chief Financial Officer Vince Tolbert during the Worcester County Public Schools Board of Education teleconference meeting held on May 19. Work was being done to create a new front entrance for the school and expand the school's playground in addition to completing the courtyard concrete paving, installation of drywall, carpet and tiles, kitchen equipment, insulation and light fixtures. Worcester County public school officials anticipated the \$40-million new school would increase enrollment when it reopened for the 2020-21 academic year in September.





Satchel Paige, who might have been the best Major League Baseball pitcher who ever lived, had this to say about always pushing forward instead of worrying about the past: "Don't look back. Something might be gaining on you."

That's good advice, as we leave 2020, that miserable, calamitous and one-damn-thing-after-another year. Forget it, if possible, and concentrate on making 2021 better than its predecessor.

There's no denying that of all the terrible events and occurrences of the past 100 years or so, the miseries of 2020 made it one of the worst, from its devastating human toll to its ridiculously stupid miscues and malfunctions that were like extra toppings at a salad bar of woe.

And no, a turn of the calendar page isn't going to make all that go away. But pressing on wisely, and with some degree of sacrifice, is what has to be done to build a better 2021. If nothing else, 2020 has driven home the point that being prepared for the unexpected is a whole lot better than scrambling to react to it.
