







The Worcester County Commissioners approved spending \$188,000 on repairs to the Ocean Pines Wastewater Treatment Facility in May after being informed that the malfunctioning equipment has reduced the capacity of the plant by 20 percent the repairs ended up being the result of negligence, when a facility employee failed to act when the head of a rake he was using fell off and jammed a pipe. Much of the debate on this topic focused on whether county taxpayers should foot the bill for someone else's error.






