

OVERTURNED

The Appellate Court of Maryland reversed a Worcester **County Circuit Court rul**ing in the case against Tyler Mailloux, 23, of Berlin, who was charged last year in the 2022 death of 14-year-old Knupp. The opinion, issued by Judge Rosalyn Tang, argues the lower court had concurrent jurisdiction and erred in its ruling to dismiss charges against the defendant. A memorial was created in 2022 for **Gavin Knupp near the** site of the fatal collision.




FARMERS MARKET EXTENDED
